If you prefer, you may call your Travel Agent to reserve your shore excursions.

About Your Excursions

Your cruise features one included excursion in each port of call; some are walking tours and others are via motor coach or a combination of walking and coach. Our excursion motor coaches are often just a few years old, are usually air conditioned and typically include restrooms. Drives rarely take more than two hours; nearly all have frequent sightseeing stops.

Please note, shore excursions are generally not offered on embarkation or disembarkation days. Optional shore excursions may be available on an overnight embark evening or with a pre-or post- cruise hotel extension program; please visit myvikingjourney.com to see what is available for your voyage. Shore excursions availability varies by departure date.

Sundays & Holidays

In many countries, shops, public buildings and banks are closed Sundays and public holidays; also, businesses in smaller towns may close for several hours midday. In these cases, a particular excursion or portion of visit may not be available, and your itinerary will vary. If you are exploring on your own on these days, your Program Director or Guest Services can suggest alternatives.

To further enhance your experience, we sometimes offer optional excursions should you want to visit an additional site or maximize your time in port. Details on these follow. Note that the order of visits may vary.

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Activity Levels

Walking tours are often over uneven ground or cobblestones and may include stairs and inclines. We have graded all our tours by activity level below, but feel free to ask your Program Director should you have any questions.

Easy

Walking portions are generally over easy surfaces, but may be uneven in parts and contain some step-ups and slight inclines. Total time walking or standing is normally not longer than 1.5 hours. Guests may need to board and disembark transport, including coaches, trains and boats.

Moderate

Walking portions may be long and somewhat challenging with occasional step-ups, stairs, inclines and uneven ground. Total time walking or standing normally ranges from 1.5 to 3 hours. Guests may need to board and disembark transport, including coaches, trains and boats.

Demanding

Physically challenging activities, including extensive walking, hiking, riding, water sports and excursions at high altitudes. Activities by foot may contain difficult and unpaved surfaces and/or multiple stairs and steep inclines. Total time walking or standing may exceed 3 hours. Guests may need to board and disembark transport, including coaches, trains and boats.

Wheelchair (available on Ocean cruises only)

Activities are suitable for wheelchair users. Guests in wheelchairs must be aided by an able-bodied companion; Viking staff is unable to assist with pushing wheelchairs or bringing them on or off the ship.

Set between Central Chile's coastal mountains and the Pacific Ocean, the fertile Casablanca Valley benefits from rich soils and cool ocean winds that help create its renowned dry white wines, such as chardonnay and sauvignon blanc. Embark on a picturesque drive by motor coach to the award-winning Casas del Bosque winery, experts in the cultivation of cold-weather varieties. Here, you will have an opportunity to savor several different wines—paired with a selection of gourmet snacks—at different stations staffed by a knowledgeable winery guide who will offer insight into your drink and pairings. A folkloric show will add to your experience, as well as striking views over the colorful landscape. Afterward, you will board your coach and return to your ship.

Chile's Thriving Capital City -- Drive across the lush Chilean Coastal Range from Valparaíso to metropolitan Santiago, Chile's capital city. Founded in 1541, Santiago is located in the country's central valley, between the Chilean Coastal Range and the Andes Mountains. The city has a downtown core of 19th-century, neoclassical architecture and winding side streets dotted with art deco and neo-Gothic treasures. Take a scenic drive past the modern sights, including the presidential palace and the beautiful cathedral in Plaza de Armas, and visit the intriguing Museum of Pre-Columbian Art. Then, continue through one of the hillside neighborhoods, the views overlooking Santiago giving it a more modern appearance. After lunch, enjoy time to explore your locale at your own pace, then continue to Patio Bellavista, a lively cultural hub featuring artisan stores, boutiques and galleries, before returning to your ship.

City Vistas and Cultural Institutes -- Discover the city of two halves, Valparaíso, and enjoy a short sojourn in Viña del Mar to visit the Fonck Museum. Valparaíso's upper area, Los Cerros, is a maze of residences nestled among 42 hills, from historic villas to small dwellings. Marvel at the views from the top, overlooking the city and bay below. Gaze out over the port and its cluster of colorful houses, then visit the Baburizza Palace, admiring its important collection of artworks by European and Chilean artists. Descend to the foot of the hill for a stroll around Plaza Sotomayor and view the naval headquarters building and the solemn Monument to the Heroes of Iquique. Continue by motor coach to the resort city of Viña del Mar and visit the Fonck Museum, a former mansion featuring archaeological artifacts and historic items from the Chilean mainland and Rapa Nui (Easter Island).

You will have the opportunity to meet three artists that keep this tradition alive, engaging in conversation as you visit their studios. Each stands out due to its location and structure, reflecting each artist's individual style. Get a sense of the artists' vision of the city and discover their connection with the porteño lifestyle. Learn about the techniques and processes that inspire their work, from concept to the creation of a beautiful masterpiece. Conclude your visit with a stop for refreshments and appetizers at a local restaurant with magnificent views over the bay before returning to your ship.

Explore its halls, then continue to the Municipal Theatre of Viña del Mar to appreciate its distinctive Belle Époque architecture. After, enjoy a panoramic drive back to Valparaíso. Pass through charming residential areas, before stopping at Plaza Sotomayor, the heart of Valparaíso's historic center. Take a moment to appreciate the monument commemorating the Heroes of Iquique, unveiled in 1886, before beginning the journey back to your ship.

In Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park, you will embark your boat for a 45-minute cruise on All Saints Lake (Lago Todos los Santos), also known as the Emerald Lake for its vivid blue-green color. Petrohué Falls and the German Towns of Puerto Varas and Frutillar -- Discover the scenic beauty of Chile's Los Lagos Region and learn about its German heritage. Arrive at Petrohué Falls, where you can immerse yourself in the stunning wilderness and untamed rivers set against the backdrop of the mighty Osorno Volcano. Climb a Volcano in Chile's Stunning Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park -- View the distinctive Petrohué Falls, climb Osorno volcano and relax by Llanquihue Lake. See the magnificent snowcapped Osorno volcano as you drive by motor coach toward the waterfalls of Petrohué. These falls were formed by the Petrohué River cascading through the area's centuries-old, volcanic rock—they are considered visually distinctive not just for their height, but for the dramatic way that water bursts through the hardened lava. Continue up to the Osorno volcano, which reaches 8,700 feet above sea level. Disembark your coach at the ski center, then enjoy time to walk around, taking in the panoramic views over the impressive Petrohué River valley. After, your descent takes you into the city of Puerto Varas, located on the shores of Lake Llanquihue. Pause for lunch, then set out to browse the city's handicraft market before returning to your ship.

Exhilarating Journey Down a Cascading Glacial River -- Accompany an expert guide and learn how to navigate a raft along the azure waters of the Petrohué River. Meet your guide for a full safety briefing, and begin your journey in calm waters before you encounter your first rapids. As you paddle down one of Chile's most beautiful and exciting glacial rivers, you will see the spectacular scenery of the Vicente Pérez Rosales National Park. This verdant national park covers more than 900 square miles through the Andes. As you navigate the waters on your raft, look for the stunning views of waterfalls, forests, mountains and the region's three volcanoes—Osorno, Calbuco and Puntagüdo. Your river guide will teach you how to maneuver thunderous rapids during this thrilling whitewater experience. Wet suits are provided and a snack will be served at the lodge or on the riverbank. Please note: participants must be in good physical condition and be able to swim. Guests over 80 years old must have a certificate of fitness signed by a physician in order to participate.

Visit a Natural Wonder of Southern Chile -- Explore the natural beauty of southern Chile's temperate rainforest during a horseback riding expedition. At the stables, you will meet your guide and receive a short briefing on horseback riding safety and gear before getting acquainted with your horse. Your ride will begin with gentle slopes, and you will appreciate the quaint rural scenery dotted with sheep as you learn about their management from your guide. Your path will then take you deep into the Valdivian temperate rainforest. This ecosystem occupies a relatively small area located almost exclusively within Chile. Marvel at the beautiful verdant canopy and lush undergrowth. If you are lucky, you may see some of the region's unique endemic wildlife including the pudu, the smallest deer in the world.

Drive to the banks of the Maullín River, where you will listen to a short safety briefing before boarding your vessel and heading out on the water; each craft will carry two guests, along with a guide, who is on hand to fully assist during your excursion. All the necessary fishing gear will be provided, with tips and hints to help with your casting technique. Fishing enthusiasts travel to this area every year in the hopes of catching one of the fish that populate its meandering waters. With a little luck and patience, you might hook one of the rainbow or brown trout, or even a salmon, that call the river home. After taking a picture with your fish, release it back into the wild, then return to shore and enjoy a light snack before returning to your ship.

Shaped by ancient glaciers, Chile’s second-largest lake features a majestic backdrop of the snowcapped Osorno and Calbuco volcanoes, which can often be seen in the reflection of its crystal-clear waters. Set out on a scenic drive by motor coach, tracing the shores of Llanquihue Lake to Ensenada. The views become more incredible with each passing mile, with lush green countryside, oxen-ploughed fields and weather-beaten barns. Pause for photographs in this scenic setting, then continue your drive to Puerto Varas, known as the “City of Roses,” where you can enjoy free time to soak up the views across the water or browse the local shops for a memento of your visit. Later, return to your coach and onward to your awaiting ship.

Lakeside Cities of Southern Chile -- Travel through two stunning lakeside cities and discover the Germanic traditions of southern Chile. Leaving Puerto Montt, you will head toward Puerto Varas, situated 12 miles away. This “City of Roses” overlooks Llanquihue Lake, where the often-snowcapped Osorno and Calbuco volcanoes are perfectly reflected in the clear waters. The coastal road leads to Puerto Varas’s main square with its manicured gardens and historic monument. Your guide will point out the city’s main features, including the German heritage evident in the traditional wood architecture of its buildings. After free time to explore, continue to Frutillar, a hamlet founded by German settlers in 1856. Enjoy a short walk, witnessing the sight of half-timbered homes boasting window boxes full of colorful flowers, then return to your ship.

Admire Verdant Vistas of Chile's Landscapes -- Don your hiking boots and set off on an invigorating hike through the picturesque Alerce Andino National Park. Between the Reloncavi Sound and Estuary, the Alerce Andino National Park spans nearly 80,000 acres, with much of it covered in thick, dense forest. Upon arrival, you will alight your motor coach and follow your guide beneath a canopy of evergreen trees. Your knowledgeable guide will point out the various species, including the coigue and the mañío, and provide fascinating insight into the alerce tree, which can grow to heights of more than 160 feet and live for more than 4,000 years. Trace the pathway along the Chaicas River, pausing for photos at scenic points. At the end of your hike, return to base and journey back to your awaiting ship.

Explore Chile's Charming South -- Discover the charm of Chile's most southerly city, situated by the Strait of Magellan on the Brunswick Peninsula. Punta Arenas was established by the Chilean government in 1848 as a tiny penal colony to assert sovereignty over the strait, but it soon became a haven for Europeans drawn to the gold rush and sheep farming boom. Today, Punta Arenas welcomes a diverse flow of visitors—from day-trippers to expedition groups—as its port is an access route to the Antarctic Peninsula. Starting at Cerro de la Cruz, you will marvel at views of the city, the Strait of Magellan, the port and the legendary Tierra del Fuego Island. You will also take a scenic drive past the Monumento al Ovejero (Sheepdog Monument), a life-size monument dedicated to local shepherds. In Plaza de Armas, the main square, you will have time to browse the local handicraft market before returning to your ship.

The Frontier City of Southern Chile -- Discover the frontier spirit of Punta Arenas, the largest city in southern Patagonia. Meet your guide and walk to the Ancud monument, dedicated to the schooner that carried the first settlers here in 1843. Stop at the historic pier to see a large colony of cormorants and observe their interesting behavior. Head toward the city center along the pleasant Colón Avenue, where you will find several neoclassical mansions including the Municipal Theater, the Braun Menéndez Museum and the Sara Braun Palace—each a reminder of the wool boom that brought business and immigrants here at the turn of the 20th century. Arrive at Plaza de Armas to see the monument to Ferdinand Magellan, the explorer who first sailed these waters, and explore the handicraft market. Climb to the Cerro de la Cruz observation deck for panoramic views of the city before returning to your ship.

Chile's Island of Fire -- Explore the world's most southerly city and discover the history of the globe's first oceanic circumnavigation.
